FROM THE PASTOR....

Many years ago, I had my first, and what could have been my last, experience with Indian cuisine. Marsha and I were on our honeymoon in London and decided to try an Indian restaurant. I remember being hungry and began eating as if there was no tomorrow. After a few bites, I was beginning to think there would be "no tomorrow". I got up and just about made the 50-yard dash to the nearest hospital. From then on, I had respect for Indian cuisine. A similar experience happened with a skunk, actually twice, but there is no happy ending to that story.

For sure, it took many years before I developed an appreciation for Indian food. Now, I like to say "eating Indian cuisine is like having a symphony on one's palate". There are tastes I never knew I had.

Over the years, I have come to learn that some of the best things in life are the result of an acquired taste. Their appreciation requires exposure and knowledge, which can lead to true delight.

Moving from cuisine to music, I must tell you how delighted I am when Marsha and I visit Puerto Rico where our younger son lives, teaches in the music conservatory and plays in the orchestra. What strikes me is how people "dress up" when they attend an orchestral event. It is obvious it is a special night. What also impresses me is the number of children, teenagers and college students who attend these concerts. When I attend a concert in New York City, my gray hair blends in with an apparent "cloud" of gray in the audience, with an occasional burst of reflected light here and there. In San Juan, my gray hair stands out in the crowd.

Enquiring on why this is the case, I learned that music appreciation is deeply rooted in the Latin culture. Venezuela has one of the best music programs in the world. In Puerto Rico, the people support the musical arts through their government and their taxes. Rich and poor are proud of the tradition and appreciative of this common musical heritage, both classical and ethnic. Through support for the arts, tickets for young people are very inexpensive and the youth of that country take advantage of the opportunity. Finland also has a wonderful music program. The result of this is that Finland has one of the best educational systems in the world. The money spent has turned out to be an investment that has "paid off". Education requires discipline and music can only be learned through disciplined learning. Plus, the benefit of these programs raises the quality of life for the people of these countries in ways that are not seen in other places, including the USA. Here, the classical arts are enjoyed mostly by those who can afford them with the vast majority of people having little, if any, lasting exposure. This is a different kind of deficit but a deficit, nonetheless.

Where I am headed here is to make this final point that the season of Epiphany exposes us to the meaning of Christmas way beyond its twelve days of celebration. In essence, the purpose of Epiphany, as a liturgical season, is to help us grow into an appreciation of what God has done in the incarnation of Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh. Each Sunday's gospel theme is designed for us to acquire a deeper appreciation for our faith in Jesus as Son of God, born of Mary. One line of a favorite hymns says it best for me, "This is he, behold the man". Each Sunday's gospel reading will draw us more deeply into an appreciation of the Word made flesh.

- + A call from God that changes a man once named Simon
- + A Word from Jesus that calls fisher folk to a new life
- + Lives marked by challenges, yet lives deeply blessed
- + Salt and light, delight and illumination
- + Love that compels action
- + Righteousness that confounds
- + Faith overcoming worry, freeing us to live a new day
- + Delight in the presence: "Lord, it is good that we are here."




