## TRANSITIONS

Life goes on and things change. These are immutable laws of nature that show themselves in every aspect of life. As we enjoy the warm, colorful spring season we are already forgetting the harsh, cold winter. We are thankful that things change.

Some changes fall easily into the rhythm of life. Others are harder to accept. We are happy when new people come into our fellowship. We are uncomfortable when time-honored ways of doing things are set aside for new ways. Our feelings about things are important to us. Yet, despite our feelings, time marches on and things change.

In May, eighteen of our children made their First Communion, an important milestone that changes their lives in ways they will discover as they grow. They have taken their place at the Lord's Table which is their birthright as baptized children of God.

This month, a dozen or so of our youth will graduate from high school, another milestone that opens the door to changes that they can only imagine. Adult life looms before them, a world which they have hoped for but whose surprises bring new challenges.

In May, we also said farewell to John Lampkin, our composer-in-residence and pianist who is retiring and moving to Florida. I am grateful to be among the folk who have been inspired, even transported, by John's artistry. I remember a time when he started to play a Chopin Prelude and I thought, what's this? Once he established the harmonic progression of Chopin's composition, he began to improvise on it, turning it into a jazz wonderland. We will not hear the likes of that again anytime soon.

Sometimes we welcome change. Sometimes we resist it. But we certainly can't avoid it. I leave you with a prayer by Soren Kierkegaard:

*O Thou Who are unchangeable, whom nothing changes, may we find our rest and remain at rest in Thee unchanging. Thou art moved and moved in infinite love by all things; the need of a sparrow, even this moves Thee; and what we scarcely see, a human sigh, this moves Thee, O infinite Love! But nothing changes Thee, O Thou unchanging!*



## LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF—"Nepal Earthquake Fund"

Dear Friends,

You may have heard by now that another powerful 7.3 magnitude earthquake struck Nepal today. Just an hour after the quake, my colleague Nicole emailed from Nepal.

*"It's been a little over an hour since we felt the second earthquake, now graded a 7.3 by USGS ... We were fortunate that in this area, everything remained stable and everyone is safe. But looking out over the terrace we could see plumes of dust rising from other parts of the city — the visual evidence of what is presumed to be more buildings collapsing."*

I am thankful that our staff are safe, but the people of Nepal need our help now more than ever. Our staff are working tirelessly to reach out to people affected by the April 25 quake — and now today's earthquake.

If you've given in support of our response, thank you!

If you'd still like to make a gift, please know your prayers and support are still desperately needed. Hundreds of thousands of people lack shelter, safe drinking water and basic necessities.

Our staff on the ground are working with partners to distribute food rations, household goods and temporary shelter. We also plan to distribute LWR Quilts and Kits. We are working in remote areas in the foothills of Mount Everest — communities heavily affected by the earthquake that may not be reached by other relief efforts.

Please continue to pray with us for the safety of the people of Nepal, and all who work to help them. And please give what you can in support of our response.
