LENT

The season of Lent began with Ash Wednesday, the day on which we are reminded of the dreadful realities of sin and death. We need this reminder not because we literally forget but because we always think that somehow we are above these things. Death is something that happens to other people; sins are things that other people do. On Ash Wednesday, we face the truth: sin and death define my life in ways I prefer not to think about. That is precisely why it's necessary to set aside time when I force myself to do it.

When we use our Lenten time wisely, we are prepared to hear the Easter news. Jesus Christ died to save us from sin and rose again to win the victory over death. This is only good news to people who realize how badly we need salvation and victory.

Our traditions for Lent include prayer, fasting and good works. Prayer strengthens our relationship with God. Fasting purifies our relationship with food and drink. Good works reinforce our interdependent existence and our need for community. These traditions are a gift to us insofar as they serve to bring us more deeply into relationship with God and one another.

Here at Good Shepherd we have a fine program of fellowship, study and prayer each Wednesday evening during Lent. A simple supper of soup and bread is followed by several options for study. The evening closes with Holden Evening Prayer. I look forward to this extra, more intimate time we have together. God bless us all on our Lenten journeys.

From the Council President – Call Committee Appointed!

Greetings to all faithful Good Shepherd members and friends. In late January the Church Council appointed a Call Committee to lead the search for a new, permanent Pastor for our beloved church. The Call Committee has the lead responsibility of helping to identify, scrutinize and eventually secure our next Pastor. Establishing this committee is the next critical step in our transition process. I urge all in the Good Shepherd family to pray for this 9-person committee as they pursue their tasks leading to recruitment of the next spiritual leader on our faith journey together.

The Call Committee has already met twice, as I write this article. They have chosen two outstanding church members, Eileen Kennedy and Walter Lauer, to serve as Co-Chairs. The other members are Sue Baumeister, George Boothby, Grace Duffy, Deborah Frederick, Wayne Kunow, Robert Lord and Ione Mensing. They will be working closely with Rev. Kathleen Koran, Assistant to the Bishop for congregations in the Metropolitan NY Synod.

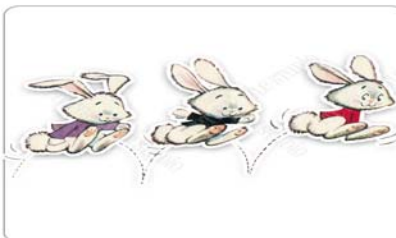
We thank and acknowledge the work of our Ministry Site Profile (MSP) Committee who assembled input from throughout the congregation and provided the final document to the Synod. The MSP will be a major resource to the Call Committee in describing our church to potential pastoral candidates, whom the Call Committee will interview. This process will likely take several months. Ultimately, the Call Committee will recommend a lead candidate to the Church Council. After review, the Council will provide its recommendation to the full congregation. All voting members of the congregation are entitled to vote at a Special Congregational Meeting to choose the Pastor. So really, everyone has a say in picking the Pastor – as it should be!

I will be providing a talk on Pastoral Transition at the ‘Lenten Communiversity’ session at 7:00 PM Wednesday, March 4th. I urge all those seeking further information about this process, and to hear an update, to attend this session in Fellowship Hall. Indeed, these are exciting times to be part of the Good Shepherd family. We all thank God for the Interim Ministry of Pastor Morris and offer prayers of support to our new and dedicated Call Committee!

FROM OUR PARISH PROGRAM DIRECTOR

SUPPORTING OUR MISSIONARIES IN SLOVAKIA



Have you been in the parlor for coffee hour lately? Did you see the Missionary for the Day display?

As we begin a third year of support for Pastor Miriam Schmidt and her husband, Jeremy Blyth, I thought it might be helpful to review what this program is about, when and why Good Shepherd got involved, and what these missionaries are doing in Slovakia.

Matthew 28:19 states: Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Through his Word, God calls us to walk alongside our Lutheran brothers and sisters to grow the church and to do God's work of restoring and reconciling communities everywhere. In 1947, responding to human suffering in the aftermath of the Second World War, the Lutheran World Federation was established. The LWF is a communion of churches of which ELCA is a member. It has grown to 144 member churches in 79 countries across the globe. As part of LWF, ELCA supports the growth of new congregations, urban and youth outreach, theological education, pursuit of justice and peace, and leadership training, just to name some of the projects.

In 1985, when Pastor John Havrilla became Good Shepherd's pastor, he collaborated with the Evangelism Committee in the initiation of support for Global Mission work. Each year, ELCA sends us a covenant documenting our contributions to these programs. Over the years, we have assisted fish farmers in Tanzania, missionaries helping in Peru and Argentina, and now Pastor Miriam Schmidt and Jeremy Blythe who are serving in Slovakia.

What are these missionaries doing in Slovakia? Pastor Schmidt explains, "Our love of adventure is of course one of the reasons we answered the call to serve as ELCA missionaries in Middle Europe, where I must be two things at once, Bratislava International Church pastor and coordinator for the YAGM (Young Adults in Global Mission) program in Hungary." The congregation is a primary English-speaking ministry in this city. They are privileged to be able to reach out to people from many different countries and backgrounds. Pastor Schmidt also coordinates the efforts of seven YAGMs currently serving in Hungary. Young adults, ages 21 – 29, serve for one year, providing critical support to ministries and projects in communities of need. Pastor Schmidt and her family frequently travel from Bratislava to Hungary, to work with the YAGMs. When they can't be in Hungary, they use e-mails and phone calls to encourage the young missionaries. Together, they are working to bring hope and healing, after years of communism.

Because of God's call, Good Shepherd joins with other ELCA congregations and with the Lutheran World Federation to support a variety of outreach services. Since 1985, our congregation has contributed financial assistance for missionaries abroad with our "Missionary for a Day" program. Please check out the calendar in the parlor, pick a day to honor a family member's birthday, anniversary, or other special event, and make a donation for that day. Through your efforts, Good Shepherd will continue to provide support for these missionaries, one day at a time.
