FROM OUR PASTOR

“For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another.”
Romans 12:4-5

Years ago, during Lent, I chose to do a series of several day fasts—as in only water for a couple of days at a time. I think I had decided on three days of fasting every other week or something like that. I had done such things before and I find fasting to be a very interesting experience—though, less so now that I have a restricted diet all the time.

Anyway, I was in the middle of one of these fasts and, coincidentally (seriously, I did not plan the timing of the topic), I was also covering metabolism in a general biology course that I was teaching. In particular that day, we were covering ketosis, or the first stages of the body's starvation response. Basically, we were talking about what was happening to my body as I was fasting and what every body does when it doesn't get food for awhile. And here is kind of what it does: it starts to eat itself. When we have no food, our body begins to break down the fats we have stored (using similar pathways with which it breaks down food) and uses that energy to continue to live. And in the middle of the class, I was struck by a (rather obvious) thought: “Wow, that's really unsustainable—my body really needs things outside of itself to live.” And then I began to wonder, how often is my spiritual life and emotional life like my body? How often do I assume that I can be self-reliant when, in fact, I have limited reserves for myself? And how is my tendency toward self-reliance in all areas of my life actually a way of eating myself?

This line of questioning led me to the conclusion that, no matter how much I might want to, I can't do this on my own. It's not actually how I was made—I was made to be in community and to need help from outside myself.

So, you'd think, having come to this epiphany, that I would be great at asking for help. Yeah ... not so much. Instead, I need to be reminded regularly that I am not self-sustaining and I need community and help (in fact, I was just reminded of this this past week when I got sick and so many wonderful people stepped up to help out). I actually think we don't have to wait until something knocks us down to be reminded of our need for each other. I believe this is a part of the point of doing spiritual practices of all kinds and an important part of how Christians do spirituality as a community thing. It is all about reminding us, cajoling us, surprising us into reaching out to others and to God so that we might find strength, grace and life—rather than being consumed by ourselves.

Now, I think this is an opposite approach than is usually taken to spiritual practices like fasting or prayer or giving gifts or volunteering or Bible study or sharing our faith with others or meditation or ... Generally, we think we do these things on our own, for our benefit, or to make us personally more spiritual or saintly. And we think that if we do them well, or do them poorly, it's all about our own strength and our own faithfulness. Instead, I'd like to challenge you to see the struggles you might have with doing these things, or the ease with which you might do these things, as an invitation to reach out to others. Consider it an opportunity to ask yourself where you are being too self-reliant or where you might need another's help or where you might be able to help someone else. Consider it an opportunity to grow not just yourself but this whole community, as well. Consider it an opportunity to lean into trusting God a little bit more with your whole self.
