Also in January, the Church Council will be appointing a 9-member Call Committee to begin working with the Metropolitan New York Synod to identify and screen potential pastors for Good Shepherd. This process is intended to take a while to get us used to change, and to be deliberate in the critical process of choosing a new pastor.

This is an exciting and faith-filled time to be part of the Good Shepherd family! Let's all stay involved, or become involved. Let's continue to support all of our church programs and keep our faith strong, vital and enthusiastic during this time of change. We are all in this together! Thank you.

WE WILL BE COLLECTING TURKEYS AND GROCERIES AGAIN THIS YEAR TO BE DISTRIBUTED TO THOSE UNABLE TO AFFORD THEIR OWN. OUR COLLECTION DAY WILL BE ON SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 23 (THE SUNDAY BEFORE THANKSGIVING). HOW EXCITING THAT THE YOUTH FROM THE UPPER ROOM WILL BE JOINING US IN THIS OUTREACH MINISTRY. WE WILL BE DISTRIBUTING THE BULK OF THE TURKEYS AT FORDHAM LUTHERAN CHURCH, IN THE BRONX. THIS IS PASTOR JONATHAN RECA-BAREN'S (OUR FORMER VICAR) CHURCH AND HE AND HIS PARISHIONERS ARE DELIGHTED THAT WE ARE COMING. ADDITIONAL TURKEYS AND GROCERIES WILL BE DISTRIBUTED TO OTHER BRONX LUTHERAN CHURCHES, AS WELL AS THROUGH THE TURKEY DISTRIBUTION OUTREACH FROM PRINCE OF PEACE, OUR SISTER CHURCH IN OLD TAPPAN, NEW JERSEY.
