Reaching and Risking to Welcome the World in the Word that has come among us in Jesus Christ.

FROM THE PASTOR

I am reminded this time of year of a greeting card that I have seen, covered with ghosts, skeletons, black cats, and orange pumpkins and it says on the front, "It's that time again when the scary, creepy, macabre creatures come out of hiding to terrify the general public..." and on the inside it reads, "It's election season!"

Perhaps it's just where I am politically, but I feel like this election season has been particularly vitriolic and we haven't actually had any substantive bi-partisan conversations about the issues that face this country (you know like the issues of homelessness and hunger within our own country—or the uncomfortable reality that most of the hungriest in this country are children ...). It seems like we are embroiled more than usual (or at least more than recently) in a political morass of mostly fear, anger, and caricatures. It's quite frightening, really, to realize that this is what has become of the great experiment in democracy and I wonder how things will proceed into the future.

One of my biggest concerns is how do we—as faithful Christians, who live in community together, who are interested in God's reign come to earth—how do we live faithfully in this time? As we approach the election in November and how we go on together afterward? Because, really, it won't matter who is elected as much as it will matter if we as a community can work together on the issues that matter the most.

I have a few suggestions about where to start.

Pray. Pray for an open heart and mind as you listen to issues that concern you and your neighbor who may be very different from you. Pray for both the candidates that they stay healthy and that they practice temperance, humility, and kindness with one another. Pray for those who disagree with you. Amazingly, God loves them, too. Pray that God help you to see them as fellow children of God and worthy of love and respect.

Listen. Listen to those you disagree with. Listen to your neighbors and their concerns, fears, and hopes. Believe them when they tell you about their lives.

Plan to vote and vote. Your vote matters—at the local, state, and federal level. Educate yourself as to the issues and go and vote. And vote in the spirit that John Wesley advised in 1774: "I met those of our society who had votes in the ensuing election, and advised them 1. To vote, without fee or reward, for the person they judged most worthy 2. To speak no evil of the person they voted against, and 3. To take care their spirits were not sharpened against those that voted on the other side."

Remember that the God who created this world continues to hold this fragile creation in God's heart. We pray "Your kingdom come, your will be done" believing that, indeed, God is in charge and even when we get it all wrong, God is working to make all things new. Trust that God's got this and though the nations rise and fall, the Word of our God stands forever.

Blessings this October! And may the ghouls and ghosties of the season keep away so that you may have peace!




MEN'S BREAKFAST GROUP




