### FROM THE PASTOR

"But now, in Christ Jesus, you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us. He has abolished the law with its commandments and ordinances, so that he might create in himself one new humanity in place of the two, thus making peace, and might reconcile both groups to God in one body through the cross, thus putting to death that hostility through it. So he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; for through him both have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone." - Ephesians 2:13-20

No guilt. Seriously.

Every week, when I stand at communion and say, "Come to the table, all are welcome here," I'm serious. Whether you've been coming forever or haven't been in ages, you are welcome. Whether you're incredibly faithful or doubting that God even exists, you are welcome. Whether you get this is all about God's grace or are struggling with your own worthiness, you are welcome. Whether you're a Lutheran or you come from some other Christian tradition, you are welcome. You are welcome at the table of God's grace. Even if you aren't Christian at all, you are welcome. It might be wise for you to not receive the bread and wine (our deepest, historic faith is that baptism is a better thing to receive first), but you are welcome for a blessing and you are welcome in the community. This is the promise of the cross of Christ. You are welcome at the table because it is your home.

Lately, we've added name tags on Sundays. Your name tag is printed and you are encouraged to pick it up on your way in. We're doing this for a couple of reasons. First of all, it helps build community when we know each other's names and we all don't know each other's names. This makes it easier for visitors to feel welcome. This makes it easier to surreptitiously learn the name of the person who has sat near you for so long you're now embarrassed to ask their name. This makes it easier for me, your forgetful, but well-meaning pastor, to not call you Frank when your name is Mike (and, yes, I was doing that to Mike for way too long until he finally corrected me). This also makes it possible to track worship attendance.

We want to track worship attendance for one reason and only one reason. Because we don't want to miss you. There is enough joyous chaos (and sometimes just chaos) on Sunday morning that sometimes we don't notice who is missing and who has been missing awhile. And we don't want to miss you. You are a part of this community and we care. We care if you are sick, if something awful is going on, if you are swamped and overwhelmed with life, or if you just need a break. We care if something at church is driving you nuts so that you don't want to come. And so we want to make sure that we don't miss you. If you haven't been in awhile, expect us to reach out. We want to know how we can be there for you. We want to know how we can pray and how we can help. We want to know how we can help you feel connected. This is part of being a community of welcome and grace.

None of this, though, is to make you feel guilty. Sometimes, when I reach out to people, I get the sense that I make them feel guilty for missing church. That is never my intent. My intent is only to remind you that this is your home, that there is a community that cares about you, that you are missed, and that you are welcome — always welcome to the table. No guilt. Seriously.

### Troesters in Zambia



The Rev. Deborah and her husband, Joe Troester, our missionaries who visited our church August 2017. They recently accepted an invitation from and have arrived in Lusaka, a beautiful city not far from the iconic Victoria Falls. Lusaka is also the headquarters of the ELCZa. This small church, established in 1983, has endured many struggles throughout its history, but now is on firmer footing, having just elected a new lead pastor (similar to a presiding bishop) and leadership team. The Troesters bring twelve years of experience living and serving in Africa to this position, and the ELCZa has welcomed them with open arms. Their knowledge and experience will assist this church as they seek to strengthen their impact in Zambia.

If everyone remembers the Troesters lived in Tanzania when they visited us,
a wonderful presentation was given around the water project they coordinated for a village, to
provide a natural, clean water source to thousands who were suffering at great lengths.

We, as a congregation, help support their work. Each of us can be part of this ministry by contributing to our "Missionary for a Day" program. Pick a day on the calendar in the coat room to celebrate a birthday, anniversary, or some special occasion, and make a donation of \$5, \$10 or whatever to this fund. 
