Reaching and Risking to Welcome the World in the Word that has come among us in Jesus Christ.

ast month, the world watched with horror as Notre Dame cathedral burned. We then watched as people rallied. "Notre Dame will be rebuilt!" rang out the cry. Money was raised in massive sums. And we were all relieved to see how much had survived. Now comes the challenge of rebuilding, honoring the true spirit of a beautiful building built to the glory of God, and acknowledging the contemporary context in which that building is raised.

As I watched all of this, I thought about how often church buildings catch on fire and how virtually none of those fires lead to the end of the Church itself. In fact, often times, fires reignite the passion of the community. So, while I'd never recommend a fire (and am very grateful for all of the safety precautions that Good Shepherd takes and for the work of firefighters in this community and beyond), I don't think they are the end of the road. They are not what destroys churches.

Other things destroy churches. And those things aren't big and obvious and news worthy. And, after watching Notre Dame's fire, I began to think about them. I think the things that destroy churches are things like hatred — hatred of others, hatred of difference — hatred eats at souls and turns us away from a God of love, a God of the cross, a God of life. And if we turn from that god, what are we worshiping? And how can a church live turned to worship something other than the God made visible in Jesus?

I know that conflict — unmanaged, unhealthy, unresolving conflict — can be deadly to churches. Conflict itself is healthy and necessary. We're all different people. And while Paul reminds us in Philippians that we should be of "one mind" in Christ, that doesn't mean always seeing eye to eye on things. It simply means that we should be honest enough to talk it through together. We should love one another enough not to let things smolder or to let disagreements spread in factions through rumors and pitting people against each other. And we should also be humble enough to not make our opinions into our gods.

I also think that apathy destroys churches. It has a way of emptying sanctuaries and disengaging volunteers (the very heart and life blood of the Church). There is this way that apathy makes us lukewarm, not really caring about much at all and that doesn't seem to jive with a passionate God nor a movement of resurrection hope (which is what the Church really is ... a movement). I've heard it said that the opposite of love is not hate but apathy. That reminds me of God's not so nice words to an apathetic church in Revelation (which I invite you to read on your own: Revelation 2: 15-22. Eesh...)

I'm beginning to think that busy-ness kills churches too. Not productive activity, that's not what I'm talking about. Churches can appear the be really busy when they are actually deeply active in productive activity. I'm talking about the way that we get going doing a million different things that don't necessarily align with our deeper meaning, purpose, or passion. I think that kind of busy-ness leads us down the road of exhaustion and apathy, and we know about how good apathy is for us.

I imagine there are more things that can run through churches like fire but more quietly, destroying them from within. What about you? What do you think are the things that destroy churches? And do you see any of these things hiding in your own heart or life? I know that I catch glimpses every once in awhile and I am grateful for the confession on Sunday morning and God's grace that calls me back to life. I'm grateful that the Church is in the Death and Resurrection business and so I know that while we die, we will live. I'm grateful for a God that continually calls us out of the grave.


