## NINTH ANNUAL GOOD SHEPHERD TURKEY RUN

In addition to turkeys (fresh or frozen), we will also be collecting: stuffing, gravy, cranberry sauce, potatoes, sweet potatoes, canned or fresh veggies. We've seen an increase in donated fresh vegetables and those are always appreciated.

Last year we collected 60 turkeys, 2 hams and a large assortment of sides. We were able to distribute a turkey (or ham) and bag of groceries to 60 families.





## PRESENT TENSE


