+ A Letter from the Pastor +

How long ago did this all start? It was mid-March when we stopped meeting in person for worship. At the time, we thought it might be a couple of weeks (though even then there was some question about whether we'd be back for Easter). But the time has dragged on. One week, two weeks, three months, and now we're in July.

Over the last (nearly) four months, we've had services online every Sunday. Morning Prayer every Monday. Evening Prayer every Wednesday. And Compline (Night Prayer) a lot of Thursdays. Plus there have been a few other videos put out: Lisa has been reading stories for the Sunday School kids every week. I've been recording occasional additional reflections; we've had a few videos of members telling jokes, and we're in the process of getting a thank-you video together to say thank you to all of those who worked during this time. Our essential workers, first responders, and others who risked their health to keep things going.

It's actually been pretty busy in the Good Shepherd community (not near as much as usual). There have also been book groups going on via Zoom. Council meetings, digital coffee hours, and Bible study. Men's Breakfast Group has even been meeting bi-weekly drawing participants from as far away as South Carolina! But, I know I certainly miss seeing people in person and I know many of you do, too.

And now it's July and we've started meeting again for worship. But it's so dribs and drabs. We can have 20 people plus helpers here for services. We're meeting outside, whenever we can and then in Fellowship Hall with good ventilation if it rains. The services are on Sunday morning at 9:30am and Wednesday evenings at 7:15pm. You can come if you like. Just let us know so we save you a space. Either online (like it says in this Voice) or call the office (845-735-2243).

Yes, the office is open again. Our hours are 9am to 1pm weekdays. We're at half-staff to keep people safe and masks are required in the office. The other thing that's happening during the week is that the sanctuary is open for private prayer on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday (hours are listed a few pages back). If you find that none of those hours work for you, let me know. We'll adjust them.

So we get to the thing I really want to tell you. Good Shepherd (along with the rest of the world) has entered a season where we aren't setting things in stone. We're experimenting. Every week. And we're watching to see what will happen, keeping everyone as safe as we can while still trying to be community together. Please check in often. And don't assume that this week will be the same as the last. We'll try hard to let you know, but communication is a two-way street.

Also, I want you to know this: during times like this, things change. Good Shepherd will not be the same community on the other side of this time. God will take us and form us and reform us as we go through this. As the Israelites in the wilderness were formed into a peculiar people by God's leading, God would like to do the same with us. One thing that I know will come out of this is a permanent usage of online live-streaming of services. We've invested in the equipment and we're building this as a ministry (if you want to help, let Lee know: glwarren@gmail.com). Another thing I know will be different is that a number of members are moving away and we will miss their presence terribly. One other thing I know is that our committees will be undergoing some major shifts as key volunteers are stepping out of their roles for the very important reason of refreshing and recharging themselves.

I don't know what else will be different. But I worry. Although we have received funds from the Paycheck Protection Program that will pay for our payrolls, fringe benefits, insurance, and utilities for May and June, I worry about our financial health at the other end of this (because it's shaky right now, y'all). I worry about how we keep community in the midst of this when we are gathering erratically and only in small groups. I worry about Creative Play and how they will continue to do the wonderful ministry that they do.

At the same time, I am in awe. Renee Bucci has stepped up into the roll of Creative Play Director as Maureen Connelly has retired, and Renee is amazing. She is rolling with the changes, thinking outside the box, and I know that the program is in very capable hands. Please read her letter later on in this newsletter! I am also in awe of the work of volunteers who've been helping with technology, recording, setting up, and figuring out all the ins and outs of being together in a COVID world. All of our staff have gone above and beyond in their work and we are so lucky to have them. Every one of them. In fact, next month, I want to spend some time featuring each one. They are amazing!

So, I know that God is up to good things. I know that God will see us through this (as God has guided Good Shepherd over 100 years along the way) and we will be a community formed even more in the grace and love of God.

Knowing that, I want to invite you to consider the question: What is your hope for Good Shepherd? What do you want us to become? Right before the world stopped, a group of us formulated a "Why" statement for Good Shepherd—basically, an answer to the question why do we exist—and the group came up with "To reach out in inclusive love and generosity so that all may know the love of Jesus." How do you see us living into that? And how do you see yourself helping so that we can? Because, without you, there is no we.

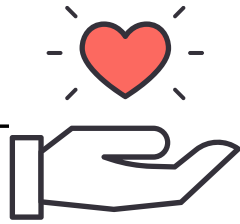

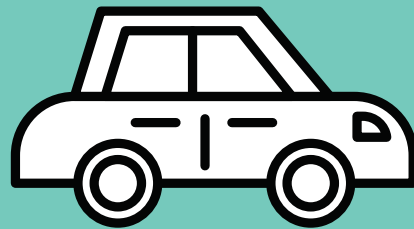

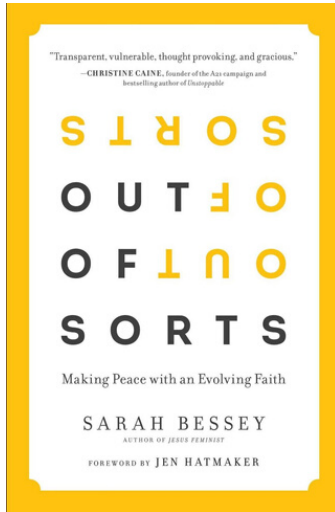

DEAR CHURCH

Pastor Lena will be leading a discussion of the book "Dear Church: A Love Letter from a Black Preacher to the Whitest Denomination in the U.S." beginning on **Monday Evenings, August 3rd through August 31st**. We will meet in person at 7pm (sitting outside whenever possible and physically distanced to stay safe).

Lenny Duncan is the unlikeliest of pastors. Formerly incarcerated, he is now a black preacher in the whitest denomination in the United States: the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Shifting demographics and shrinking congregations make all the headlines, but Duncan sees something else at work—drawing a direct line between the church's lack of diversity and the church's lack of vitality. The problems the ELCA faces are theological, not sociological. But so are the answers.

Part manifesto, part confession, and all love letter, Dear Church offers a bold new vision for the future of Duncan's denomination and the broader mainline Christian community of faith. Dear Church rejects the narrative of church decline and calls everyone—leaders and laity alike—to the front lines of the church's renewal through racial equality and justice.

It is time for the church to rise up, dust itself off, and take on forces of this world that act against God: whiteness, misogyny, nationalism, homophobia, and economic injustice. Duncan gives a blueprint for the way forward and urges us to follow in the revolutionary path of Jesus.

to everyone who made our Blood Drive a success!

On Tuesday, June 30, Good Shepherd hosted a safe, by appointment-only Blood Drive in Fellowship Hall. We were able to collect 63 units of blood. We had projected this blood drive at 50 units, so this is an excellent result (126% of goal)! Each whole blood unit has been separated into a red cell, platelet and plasma component. So our blood drive has resulted in as many as 161 blood components entering our community blood supply and going on to touch the lives of as many as 161 patients and their loved ones! Great job, all. We plan on having the New York Blood Center back again soon. Stay tuned for more information!

Creative Play News

Congratulations to Maureen Connelly on her retirement! Renee Bucci has stepped up into the role of Creative Play Director.

We will return calls and emails; please be patient.*

Dear Creative Play Families,

First and foremost, I hope to find all of you well and healthy! I understand that the current times lend much uncertainty. Our intention is to open Creative Play in September, with great discretion in providing a safe environment for the children, our families and our staff.

Guidelines, advisement, theories, data have been changing daily. Our program needs time to ride the rollercoaster; some peaks may be scarier than others; our emotions go up and down with the decision process, but ultimately being able to provide an environment that is safe, loving, emotionally stable for your child's learning needs would bring the biggest thrill.

What might this look like?

- Staggered arrival/dismissal times
- Smaller classes
- Changes in the layout of the classroom to allow for social distancing
- Temperature checks
- Outside classroom door drop-off, pickups on lower level of the building
- A change in the families work schedule (one helping parent, condensed work schedule rather than traditional throughout the school year; a push for Opt-Out)
- Fewer materials in a classroom, for safety of sharing and sanitizing
- Daily sanitizing of the classrooms
- Remote learning on staggered days
- Individual class activities, no multi-group events
- All to be determined and adjusted, as needed

We do not want to compromise the social/emotional development aspect of our program as it is extremely important in an early childhood education. The literature we are sending was created with intentions of moving forward, as you read; please understand we may need to amend some content to best service your child. Our program, in order to field our conversions to classes, will need to know how many families plan on participating in September. If you have made the decision to withdraw your application from Creative Play, please inform us immediately.

Angela and I will be working on all measures to create a balancing act over the summer. We hope you understand how truly dedicated we are to serving your children and our community with our pre-school program.
