Well, it's November.

We've almost made it to the end of a year that most of us will be happy to put behind us. The year 2020 has been anything but a fun one. And this month, with this rather contentious election, and the weather pushing us inside, and the looming concerns about a second wave ... ugh.

I want you to know that no matter what happens that God is near. Even on the cross, for heaven's sake (Actually, it was for earth's sake, for our sake), God was there! That's the promise of the good news, the gospel of Jesus. God does not abandon God's creation to death. God wraps our hurting world in love and leads us toward transformation. Often in ways and times and places that we don't expect. With people we'd rather forget (because God excludes no one). Most often God does this by taking us straight through hell itself (that's where the church figures that Jesus was busy at work on the day between the crucifixion and resurrection ... rending the gates of hell).

Why does this matter? Because while we are living in uncertain times, there is something certain, real, definite, that we can hold on to: a God who leads us, who pours out grace upon our hurting world, who cries for justice in wild places, who promises to make deserts bloom.

And if we can hold on to that God in the midst of this, it is a lot easier to let go of all the much less certain things around us. Things we tend to hold on to in fear and self protection. Things that really don't last and cannot guide us.

If we let go of those things and trust that God has got us, I think we actually have a chance. A chance to turn off the anxiety-laden conjecture pundits online and on the news. A chance to let the anxiety go. A chance to ground ourselves in truth rooted in the holy earth on which we walk. A chance to walk in ways of mercy and healing. A chance to listen to others and find common ground. If we find a little faith in the God who breathes creation into being, I think we actually have a chance to take a breath, look around us, and see who needs a hand and some heart. And then to reach out to our neighbors in need.

This is how we will make it through this time. It is how people have made it through all the hard times that humanity has survived. By letting go of certainty in the things that rust and rot away and turning in love to God and our neighbor, finding life and healing for the moment there. And, of course, moment by moment, we live out a lifetime and experience eternity.





Our Troop was able to continue our support and activities in a limited fashion and we want to highlight a few of our activities below:


- WELCA survival kits: The Troop donated 36 kits to support this worthwhile cause

For the past three years I have run a half or half marathon along the Jersey Shore. In 2017, it was the Ocean Seaside Heights half marathon; in 2018 and 2019 the Atlantic City Marathon and this year the first-ever virtual Atlantic City Marathon!

Steeped in tradition and history, the Atlantic City marathon is the third longest running marathon route ever in the United States. Normally I would be running 26.2 miles along the Boardwalk in Atlantic City, with one run from the end of the route to another, including the infamous Atlantic City casinos, restaurants, bars and entertainment. However, this year, due to precautions and statewide sanctions on all long distance running events, we had to coordinate our own route, water stations, and race preparations.

Without being able to run in Atlantic City as a formal race, rather than try to run along the Boardwalk during the elements of fall and struggle to tread on the unusual surfaces of wood, rather than road, I decided to run in Long Beach Island, just up the road from Atlantic City. My family, mother, and aunt-in-law, have a family home there and they very kindly allowed me to stay there for the weekend. Some of them even came along and supported me along the route!

My wife, Liza, very faithfully drove along my route providing water, snacks, love, and support, all the way around. Thank you, Liza! It was a grueling run from 16 miles to the finish line as I had severe cramp and was carrying an injury on my hips from continuous running, exercising, and strain on both my legs. As reality set in, I soon realized I would not be able to achieve my goal of beating my personal record time of 3:02. This was not something that sat well with me and caused me to have even more of a mental battle with the outcome of the race as I was running so slowly. When you train for a marathon you always train hard, long and endure many miles in preparation for the big race day. As people normally would race with you, cheer you on, or support from the sidelines, it was quite lonely, given the reduced number of people in LBI, lack of crowds to cheer the runners on, and the realization I was the only person running the race along this route.

Then, as the race ended, I reached Holgate, stretched off, checked my time and then hours later wanted to check my race placing. In the previous two years, I had finished in the top ten percent and wanted to see how I did this year considering there were only around 150 runners. However, I wasn't too hopeful of high placing given that my time was slower than my two previous marathons. Yet, here we are in the middle of a global health crisis and anything can be possible, due to so few people entering. In the end, only 47 people entered their times and the third place gave their time as 3:29, second as 3:23 and then, somehow, with absolutely no credit to myself my time of 3:10:54 was enough to win! To my shock and undeserved response, I had finished first in the first ever Atlantic City Marathon. What an achievement, what a race and what an accomplishment just to finish.

However, the main person who deserved the credit was my wife for helping me get around the course, my in-laws for providing us with accommodation, and our God for humoring me enough to realize that in my own strength I will lose by not recording a good time, but in his strength I will be able to achieve more than I could ever hope or imagine, and win the race! Thank you Lord, thank you Atlantic City, thank you Liza, and thank you Linda and Linen!
