

"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" - Isaiah 43:19a

While the snow is receding rapidly, thanks to warmer weather, I want you to think back to when it first started to melt. I wasn't that long ago, after all. Everything was buried and it was difficult to navigate, and we were so tired of it all, as yet another wave of pretty flakes coated everything in another layer of white. But then, it started to warm up, and the snow, almost unnoticed at first, began to melt.

One of the first places I noticed the snow disappear was along the retaining wall around the church. Suddenly, it seemed that the tiniest of green plants and mosses were uncovered along the edge of the wall. Alive. Happily continuing, as though winter didn't matter to them at all.

I have always been fascinated by those tiny green plants. When I was a kid in Alberta, and the winter had gone on and it was January, and I hadn't seen the ground without snow since October. I'd go out and play in the woods, bundled up against the cold, and dig down until I found the frozen ground—often under snow deep enough for my young self to disappear into.

What amazed me was that I always found green things. Living mosses and tiny green plants that seemed to withstand winter beneath the snow, absorbing whatever sunlight seeped through the deep blanket of iciness. Living, even though they seemed so fragile and small, in defiance of the deadly cold. Surviving, despite it all.

The world looked so dead and yet below the surface, so much was alive.

I try to remember that right now—that there is so much more going on than meets the eye. That life refuses to give up, even when it's hard. I think we all need that reminder, in this season. I've heard a lot of people talking about being tired and worn out. People feeling depressed and struggling to find the motivation to do anything. If you feel that way, know that you're not alone. If you feel that way, know that it's perfectly reasonable to be feeling this right now.

I know that it's because of the pandemic that has gone on for too long. The fatigue of looking at screens and not people's faces. The tediousness of masks and more sanitizer. The never-ending anxiety of vaccines, the risk of getting sick, the awful politics, and ... have you taken a deep breath lately? The same conversation again and again about how we're all tired of the pandemic and nothing else. And it's also the weather—the grey days that linger, the sky and the earth the same color, the cold that keeps us inside. All of this serves as a heavy blanket weighing, us down.

Still, I want to give you the hope of those tiny green plants to think about. I remember as a kid, how they astonished me in a world so devoid of color, so hostile to life. There is something truly astonishing going on beneath the surface of our days. Life continues. God's gifts of breath, love, and hope sustain us, and refuses to end; despite it all. Jesus reminds us that God is at work in tiny things, when he says the kingdom of God is like yeast hidden in flour; a pearl of great price, and treasure buried in a field, and even a weed as small and insistent as mustard. As fragile and small as divine grace can sometime seem, it has the resilience not only to live, but to grow into Spring.

Hang in there. Easter is on its way. Life makes its way, when there seems like there is no way, because God makes a way.

Speaking of Easter, we will be worshipping together in person on Palm Sunday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. Look for more information about that in the coming weeks as we work out the details so we can be safe and be together. It will be good to see you!


