

It's hard to believe it's almost Lent. This year, Ash Wednesday is on February 17th. For Ash Wednesday this year, there will be an online service that will premiere at noon, and I'll be doing Ashes to Go at the church, from 1pm-3pm, and again from 5pm-7pm. I hope you'll stop by to get ashes. If you pull up and no one is around during that time, I'll be warming up in the entrance to the Education building.

And so, thus will begin Lent. Almost a whole year after we had to lock down, the first time, for COVID. Thinking about this, I really wanted our Lenten practice to reflect less on the usual things during Lent – the practices of fasting and giving things up – and more about God with us in the wilderness. We've kind of had a whole year of giving things up, and while there are a lot of promising signs, I have a feeling we have a ways to go. So, while we continue to live in the wilderness, where are the signs of God around us?

One frequent image of God in the wilderness, is as a rock. Rocks were used in the wilderness to mark holy places. Large rocks served as shelters in the night, and shade in the day. Rocks were guides in the landscape and likely places where water would be found.

So, during Lent, we're going to focus our collective prayer life around rocks. We will have a space cleared in front of the outdoor cross for you to come and leave a rock behind. Do you have something weighing on you? Something you need to set at the foot of the cross? Write or draw something to represent it on a rock and leave it at the cross. Need a rock to write on? We'll make sure there are some available there. We will build, over the course of Lent, an Ebenezer together. Do remember what that is? It was a rock pile built by the Israelites, as they crossed over the Jordan into the promised land, to remind themselves that God had brought them this far along the way, and that God would lead them forward. So, at Easter, we can remember the same promise holds for us, as well. That even in death and resurrection, God goes with us.

Expect hymns and the reflections on Wednesday nights, which will be on YouTube, to also reflect on rocks. Rock of Ages, Cleft For Me. Jesus is a Rock in a Weary Land. Built on a Rock, the Church Shall Stand ... we've got lots of hymns that we love, that reflect on God as a rock, in the middle of our uncertain world. A rock worth resting on.

And the series of reflections will be as follows:

February 24 - Building Altars in the Wilderness March 3 - Water from a Stone: Reminders of God when it's Hard March 10 - Leaving Stones as Stones March 17 - The Shadow of a Rock in a Thirsty Land: Grace to Rest March 24 - The Rocks Will Cry Out: Silent Sentinels of Hope

Also, look out on our social media for more reflections and meditations, during this coming season. I hope that you will take time this Lent to reflect on God with you.

I hope you'll take some time to leave something at the foot of the cross. And I hope that we can journey together to the Resurrection Dawn.


Centering Prayer & Meditation






SOUPERBOWL SUNDAY

All Alumni and Church Member Families,

Applications for the new school year 2021-2022 are now available in the school office. If you would like to register your child for a program for the next school year, please stop by the Creative Play Fffice to pick up an application. In order to assure placement in your preferred class, please apply by **February 12, 2021**. After this date we open up enrollment to new members.

For the 2021-2022 school year, the following classes will be available to your family, providing we have the minimum enrollment required to proceed with each of the classes:

- Time for Two Classes (call for available days)
- 1 day a week Toddler Classes (meets on Wednesdays & Thursdays)
- 2 day a week Toddler Class (2 hours, 9:45am 11:45am, Tues. & Thurs.)
- 2 day 3-year-old classes (2.5 hours, 9:30am 12:00pm)
- 3 day 3-year-old class (3 hours, 9:00am 12:00pm)
- 3 day 3-year-old class (2.5 hours, 1:00pm 3:30pm)
- 3 day 4-year-old class (2.5 hours, 9:30am 12:00pm)
- 5 day 4-year-old classes (3 hours, 9:00am 12:00pm)
- UPK (Universal Pre-Kindergarten classes offered in the morning and afternoon) *Your placement in one of our UPK classes is dependent on your approved application from the CCRR (Child Care Resources of Rockland) office.
- Creative Creations, Enrichment afternoon classes

For the school year 2021-2022, we are again making an "opt-out" choice available to all families. By selecting this "opt-out" choice, you will pay a pre-determined amount, to cover some, or all of your workdays, in the classroom. The office will arrange to have your work days covered, after speaking with you, and determining your needs. We understand many families would love to attend Creative Play, but due to work and other obligations, cannot participate in the cooperative workdays. We have traditionally relied on families to help share the information regarding our school, and would appreciate your help, by sharing the above information with family and friends. While our classrooms will continue to reflect our mission of play with a purpose, we are excited to incorporate some new opportunities as well! We are planning a walk across the Governor Cuomo Bridge (formerly Tappan Zee), on a Saturday in March! More details TBA, look out for more informatioN!




Dear Good Shepherd Families,
