"Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching." - Hebrews 10:23-25

It's been really wonderful in worship lately. I keep seeing people I haven't seen in ages. The refrain from everyone has been, "I forgot what this meant to me."

I'm glad they had a chance to remember.

There's so many reasons not to come back to worship. Anxiety about the virus, getting busy, falling out of practice, engaging in church and community in other ways.

But there's a few really good reasons to try to make it to worship. I know you have your own reasons to come. Maybe you come for the space to pray once a week. Maybe you come to see people you only see on Sunday. Maybe you come to sing. Maybe you come to receive communion or the proclamation of forgiveness or a word of grace in the texts and sermon.

The author of Hebrews suggests a couple of other reasons to gather together: to help each other love and to keep our priorities straight. When we come together to worship, we are reminded of the love of God for the world and ourselves. We are reminded of God's call for justice in the world. We are reminded of the way that God is hiding (or sometimes not hiding) in the face of our neighbor. We are reminded there is grace for us. And when we are reminded of those things, I think it's a little easier to remember what is worth doing with our time. We all have far too little time

I was reading in a book called Time Management for Mortals by Oliver Burkeman about the classic visual example of time management of the jar with large rocks, gravel, and sand. And you fill the jar with the large rocks first, then the gravel, and then the sand. If you do it in that order, then everything fits. The large rocks being really worthwhile things, the gravel being less important stuff, and the sand being the busy things that tend to fill our lives but don't mean much. Burkeman calls this whole model a deceptive trick. Because in reality there's far more large rocks than will fit in the jar. There are far more important things to accomplish then we can ever fit in our lives. And so, we make choices about what is most important out of a lot of really important things. And other things we have no choice but to set aside. And that is the reality and grace of being mortal.

I think being a part of a faith community can help give clarity to what we set aside. And I think that being a part of a faith community can also help give us the grace we need to let go of things that we know are "really good" to do, but we just can't.

So, there's a few good reasons to come and worship. Maybe you have more?

Know, when you get a chance, there's a place for you at the table. I hope to see you soon.

STEWARDSHIP CORNER =

I've been thinking a lot about "time" lately. Maybe it's the season, where the shorter days make me feel pressed for time. Maybe it's my age. As a kid, when the teacher would say in June, "See you next year," I thought that summer was literally a year long, as the time seemed to stretch forever. Now, days, weeks, months, and years seem to fly by in the blink of an eye. I'm sure all of you have probably experienced this at one time or another.

I've been thinking a lot about how Time is one of the gifts that God has given us, and how I choose to use that gift. I have realized that when I use this gift to help others, I feel better myself. That's not to say that I don't play games on my phone when I should be doing something else, like writing this Temple Talk. I just mean that even if I am tired or feeling overwhelmed, I sometimes feel an internal nudge to do a given thing. At those times, when I allow myself to be guided and be truly present in service to others, I walk away feeling at peace. You may be wondering if this is when I make my pitch to have you usher. I won't. I promise. Instead, I have three requests to make of you. These requests all have to do with Stewardship.

Stewardship, at its best, most perfect, is a way of life. It is how we use all of the gifts that God has granted us, trusted in us, and how we use them to love God and love our neighbor. Think about that for a minute. What would the world look like if we all lived a life truly in service to one another? Where we all found joy in being a community and at peace, at the end of the day, knowing that we accomplished what God had set for us to.

Stewardship encourages us to look Down, In, and Out. We see how God has come down to us, we look in to discover the gifts that we have been entrusted with. We then look out of ourselves, to our neighbors, to see and understand their needs.

I somehow missed this full meaning of Stewardship until a few months ago. I knew that it had to do with giving, but thought solely in monetary terms. My guess is that I am not alone in this misunderstanding. One part of Stewardship is about money. I mean, without money, we wouldn't have staff, or lights, or heat, or a myriad of other things. Treasure is definitely one of the gifts that God gives. But, there are actually three "T"'s when we think about Giving. This treasure, or money, is definitely important, but no more important than the other two T's. These are the gift of Time and the gift of Talent.


In a week or so, you will be receiving in the mail a list of all of the events that we would like to hold here at Good Shepherd. There are check boxes next to each where you can let us know if you would like to volunteer at that specific event, or if you would like to just attend. So, here is my first request. Before you look at the list, take a moment or two to take a deep breath and ask God to come down to help you see where he would like you to be on those dates. As you slowly read each event, look in and wait to see if there is that internal nudge. There may not be, as God needs you elsewhere on those days. Or it may be that God wants you to come as a participant and not a volunteer. That's okay. Who am I to argue with God?

My second request is that we all commit to physically coming to church once a month. Just come. We miss you. You are needed here, just by being you and being here. We are enriched by your presence and I think you will find yourself enriched by the others here.

My third request is that you look Down, In and Out. Commit to an hour a week to seek where God has come down, what gifts he has given you, and then use those gifts in service to others. I know that an hour seems like a lot, but fortunately God has also given us the gift of minutes that an hour can be broken into. Maybe you pray for 5 minutes a day, seeking guidance. And then 15 minutes on the phone to someone who is lonely. Maybe you buy some extra food for that homeless person you pass every day on the way to work, and sit and eat with them.

There are so many needs out there, but you are not meant to solve them all by yourself. If we trust in God, stewarding the bountiful gifts that He has given us, listen for that nudge, we will be exactly where we are supposed to be, using the exact right gifts, helping those that we were meant to.




