Can I invite you to come to worship during Holy Week?

For some, it's been awhile since you've made it. So much has gone on. So much has changed. So much good and bad stuff in the last few years. And you're so out of the habit of getting up on a Sunday morning and coming to church.

It's okay, you know. You're invited anyway. This is your home. You are always welcome here. The place is better with you here.

I've been asked by a few people lately who are finding their way back how the church is doing. I have not been sure how to answer that question. Honestly, we're struggling financially. Even down a staff person, there's less coming in than going out. That's concerning to me. It's not an impossible situation, by any stretch, and I've seen the incredible generosity of the people of Good Shepherd throughout this time in unexpected and amazing ways. But, the budget doesn't look beautiful, if such a thing is possible.

I notice attendance in worship creeping up here and there. That's lovely and exciting and it is so wonderful to see the faces of those I haven't in quite awhile. Even some new faces. Even some faces that have been there all along that I can now enjoy seeing their smiles again because they are mask free. Even as I see all of this, I see the empty places. Those I know who will not come back. Because they moved away. Because they died. Because life and other things have pulled them away so that they would rather not return. Those empty spaces make me reflective of what will be different as we recover in a post-pandemic world.

There's lots going on here again. The building is bustling with energy and activity as people come and go with the preschool, the community organizations, the activities of church life, the scouts, and more. I'm amazed and blessed by all of it. It feels so very normal for this place and so very healthy indeed. At the same time, it's not what it was before. And that would be a mistake to pretend or imagine that it could be exactly as it was before. It's new again. And it makes me imagine what could be, what new things might be.

So with all of this floating in my head, I'm looking forward to Holy Week. And I really hope you will come, too.

It's a chance to celebrate being together. It's a chance to feel the forgiveness of God. It's a chance to break bread and be reminded of the love of God for this hurting world and our love for each other. It's a chance to think about how we serve, reflecting a God who serves and loves passionately. It's a chance to mourn together the death of so much along with Jesus. And it's the chance to be struck by hope. Hope of life that overcomes death. Hope that leads us to new things.

Let's be an Easter people together.



Dominican Republic

In Dominican Republic, the economic strain on parents in poor communities to provide necessary school supplies for their children is often insurmountable. Parents are sometimes forced to sell a cow or goat to cover the costs of their children's educations. A distribution of **85,000 School Kits** — tangible symbols of God's love for struggling families — by LWR partner Food for the Hungry meant parents didn't need to make extreme sacrifices to keep their kids in school.

LWR's partner, Union of Investments and Humanitarian Projects, worked with local social service agencies and government officials to identify **50,000 people** in the greatest need to receive Quilts, Personal Care Kits, School Kits and Baby Care Kits and feel God's love through your gifts.

Some **150,000 people** in women's organizations, farmer and artisan cooperatives, schools, health centers, support groups

for people with disabilities and social service organizations in some of Mali's most remote areas received your Quilts, Personal Care Kits, School Kits, Baby Care Kits and Fabric Kits.
