#### FROM THE PASTOR...

I hope this note finds you all well. It's so hard to believe that the summer is ending and September has come crashing in on us. Hopefully, you got to enjoy some time to re-create this summer. We were certainly fortunate in this area that our summer was so beautiful. Not near as hot as some places, still wet enough for gardens ... we're so, so blessed.

I'm grateful for the time I've been able to rest this summer—the chance to visit my family, and a bit of time to slip up to Lake George for a bit. I've also really enjoyed being able to get together with lots of you, as Nancy has been scheduling visits. It's wonderful to get to know you better, to check in, to figure out how we reconnect.

Sadly, on top of these great things, it's been a summer of deaths, particularly the deaths of the young. This past Sunday, I learned of the sudden death of Christina Warner. Her funeral, scheduled for September 8th, will be the third funeral \*this summer\* that I've done for a young woman under the age of forty.

I wish I was better at brushing off the grief that I inevitably pick up from funerals. It is not my loss to grieve. I can only walk beside others as they grieve. But, I have this way of holding the pain of others. Of course, there's a part of me that is grateful for that part of me. I'd hate to get numb to the grief of loss and the many complicated feelings that come along with mourning the loss of loved ones. But, it is something that I really do struggle with. Funerals for the particularly young certainly weigh even more than most.

Those deaths also just really make me stop. Life is so short. Time is no guarantee of anything. It makes me wonder about the time I've been given and if I'm being a good steward of the time I have been blessed with. A regular refrain of almost all of us is, "I want to do that, but I just don't have the time." This lingering regret of not choosing what we most want to do ... It just makes me think and want to commit more deeply to living the life I'm called to live.

It makes me think of that quote from Mary Oliver, "Tell me, what are you going to do with your one wild and precious life?" Obviously, the answer for the poet was not to have a more traditionally "productive" or "successful" life. She spent a lot of days walking in the woods and watching the natural world. She did not move with hurry and rush, but with intention and reflection, being caught, on occasion, by wonder and holiness.

I don't think that's so different than what Jesus invites us to when he says, "I came that they may have life and have it abundantly." I'm more than sure it's not an abundance of busyness that Jesus calls us to, but an abundance of life. Of noticing the infinite preciousness of the moment. Of being surprised by the wild abundance of life. Of exploring and wondering at the mystery of the holiness of God in this and the next and the next breath...

I hope these aren't too erratic things to reflect on and that I make some sense. I pray that you maybe get to stop a bit to notice, to rethink, to reflect. Your life is too very precious to have it run away blind to the wonder of it all. And if you need some help remembering how to touch the holy or want with some people to explore these questions of belief and death and life and all that is in between ... let's do that together.
