


People to People October Collection

Council Capsule

Your Church Council met on September 17th. Among the topics discussed were the following: Deacon Gina: Deacon George Guinan, the chair of the Synod Diaconate Council came to meet with us and explain the necessary covenantal letter of agreement for Gina to continue to serve at Good Shepherd. We reviewed the document and Council and Gina agreed with the boundaries and responsibilities set forth by the document.

- August September Financial Notes: Total receipts through August 2024 were \$221 thousand. Total expenses through August 2024 were \$254 thousand, resulting in net expense for the first nine months of the fiscal year of approximately \$32 thousand. The largest expenses year to date, outside personnel related expenses, were for gas and electric services, grounds maintenance, and insurance. Total expenses are generally in-line with budget.
- Octoberfest It was decided to postpone this until next year. We will instead focus on continuing with the International Luncheon in January.
- Building and Grounds –The town is fixing the pipe that runs from our drain across the street, so we are hoping there will be no more flooding in Fellowship Hall.
- Solar panels The company we use filed chapter 11 bankruptcy so that is who no one is getting back to us about fixing the broken inverters.
- Boilers *Jimco* is coming to look at the furnaces to see what works needs to be done before we have to turn them on.
- Communion We will keep it every week at both services.
- Red Hymnals The idea of going back to the hymnals was discussed. It was decided to leave it as is with the paper copies for now and revisit this idea in the new year.
- Fall Clean up This will be done on November 23rd along with the *Turkey Run* and hope that there is some volunteer overlap.
- Weeding &Trimming Council voted to incorporate weeding and trimming into the annual landscape contract, with the cost of weeding being \$200 per time and trimming \$475 per time. Weeding will be as requested and the trimming will be 3 times a year. The question of who should be in charge of caring for the columbarium was brought up.
- Social ministry Update The Turkey run will be taking place on 11/23/24, 8am to 11am, and the turkeys will be going to West Haverstraw Elementary again. The Personal Care kits were delivered and we are going to continue doing this and also with the backpacks and lunch bags. The Warming Center is in need of volunteers from November to April. Claudia Belgean will organize this. The Victims of gun violence vigil will be done at Domincan Sisters in Sparkill this year.
- Sunday School Everyone is back from last year.

- We continue to arrange for Supply Pastors for Sunday worship, while the Bishop's office works toward finding us an Interim Pastor.
- We have arranged for Pastor Lauri Craig to lead worship with us on: October 6th, 13th, and 20th. Pastor Rich Bowman will lead worship with us on October 27th, November 3rd and November 10th.
- Pastor Ernie Mossl continues to assist in the administration of the basic operations of the congregation, meet with the congregational Council and provide for basic pastoral care and services.
- Once we have an Interim Pastor, we will create a Transition Team and eventually establish a Call Committee to pursue calling a new Pastor.

Council is working closely with the Bishop's office to navigate our next steps. We will continue to keep you informed as things transpire.


