Q: Are you the group that plans our social events?

A: Planning the kinds of fun social events that we have at Good Shepherd is a wonderful and important form of service to our congregation (and we do love a good get-together!) Q: Are you the group that goes out to share the Gospel with the community?

Council Capsule

Your Church Council met on July 22nd and August 19th.

Among the topics discussed were the following:

Pastor's Report – Pastor Ernie directed us to the report he had emailed and reviewed it with us. He highlighted some of the visits he has made and he shared information about a recent death and funeral. Pastor also shared that he performed a baptism at a home, enabling the grandmother, who is on hospice, to attend. There will be a public recognition of the baptism on an upcoming Sunday. Bible study is going on through the summer. Confirmation Class is not meeting during the summer, but Pastor and Kristen continue to be in contact with the Confirmation families; some of the students have been participating in worship services. Confirmation class will resume the first Thursday in September.

Financial Update - Total fiscal year-to-date receipts through July 2025 were \$194 thousand. Total fiscal year-to-date expenses through July 2025 were \$233 thousand, resulting in net expense for the fiscal year of approximately \$39 thousand. The largest expenses year to date, outside personnel related expenses, were for supply pastors, gas and electric services, grounds maintenance and attempted boiler repairs. Total expenses were approximately \$6 thousand over budget.

Parsonage – Jeff provided an update on the parsonage situation, explaining that while a Pastor and his family had shown an interest, uncertainty about the Pastor future role in the church he is in now has made their potential move less likely. The Council agreed to see how things progress over the next week or two, but if they fall through, to continue seeking other options for a parsonage tenant, acknowledging the need for careful screening of potential candidates.

125th Anniversary Burns Proposal – In June, Council reviewed a proposal presented by Brian and Elaina regarding raising funds for a new piano for the sanctuary in celebration of the 125th Anniversary. Kristen and Kim drafted a letter to them, that was then approved by Council, outlining the discussion and explaining that the money would be put in a fund, with the caveat that if the cost was not met, other options would have to be looked at. The importance of clarifying to the congregation, that this is separate from other capital campaign type expenses we have been talking about, was stressed. We expressed this to Brian and Elaina and they pointed out that the majority of their target audience is actually outside the church in the music community.

Sunday School – Sunday School registration will take place on Sunday 9/14; the first actual day of Sunday School will be Sunday 9/21, when we return to two services. We will have one 9:30 service for 9/7 and one 10:30 service on 9/14, so all will have the opportunity to join in for Hot Dog Sunday (9/14.)

Sunday Services – Council had an in-depth conversation as to whether we should we go back to two services or stay with one. Everyone agreed that it is nice to see everyone at the one service, but offering two times has its benefits, as well. It was decided to do a survey to see what the congregation prefers. For now, until we collect more data, we will return to an 8:30am service and a 10:30am service starting on Sunday, September 21st. It was also brought up that if we are going back to two services, we need to have more people agree to volunteer.

Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT) – This is the online survey that will be sent out the entire congregation as a part of the transition process. This provides a way for everyone's voice to be heard. The CAT is a custom-built survey for the congregation. It is sent out and then the data is collected over a four-week period, and will be part of our ministry site profile (MSP.) The MSP is what pastoral candidates look at when they are looking to interview at a church. Questions are answered online. For those who don't have computers, a PDF will be printed for our members/worshipers to fill out. We also hope to have laptops available on Sundays (TBD) for those without computer access. Additionally, we are also trying to arrange to have volunteers available to sit with anyone who would like help, if their anonymity is not important to them. Holy Cow Consulting is the company that conducts the survey and Pastor Ernie said they have been great to work with. After the data comes in, the company will put it into charts and graphs, and will hold a teleconference to interpret the data with the Transition Team. A letter will be sent to the congregation around Labor Day, introducing them to the CAT, and will include the access link.

Server Migration and Windows I I – The Council reviewed a proposal from Eagletech for upgrading the church's IT systems, including replacing old desktops, migrating to a new server, and upgrading various church systems. Jeff presented the \$4,545 total cost, which includes \$2,500 in labor. After considering the local nature of Eagletech, the critical importance of the update taking place, and the included annual backup service, the Council agreed to move forward with the proposal.

Synod Giving – Pastor shared that he is aware that we stopped giving to Synod due to money concerns. Two things concern him regarding that action. First and foremost, it is biblical to give, to express our faith. We ask our members to give, and therefore, we as a church are also expected to give. From a more practical standpoint, we are going to be asking the Bishop's office for pastoral candidates. Carole added that the synod has been supportive of us through what we have been going through. Everyone agreed that we have to try to give something.

Coffee Hours – An email was sent to Council sharing that Social Ministry had taken over coffee hours this past year to start it up again, but it falls more appropriately into Fellowship, so they are looking for other people to take over. Pastor Ernie committed to continuing to put coffee on each Sunday. If someone brings something to eat, that's great, but if not, that's ok too. The group agreed to explore having different groups host coffee hours monthly and considered stockpiling simple snacks to ensure availability. If anyone would like to host a coffee hour please let us know.

Property – The need to restripe the parking lot was discussed and it was decided that it will be done on Saturday, September 6th, at 9:30 AM, with Rob coordinating the effort using the church's equipment. It was also agreed to organize an outdoor clean-up day on Saturday, September 13th, at 9 AM, to address overgrown weeds, trimming bushes and hedges, and cleaning the gutters.

Mark Olsen has been working on filling cracks in the church ramp this week. Thank you to Mark.

Kim shared that there was a lot of rain a few weeks ago and a couple inches of water accumulated at the bottom of the Fellowship Hall ramp; it was coming in around and under the door. Jeff suggested replacing the bottom part of the door. Rich and Sue Baumeister had reported that the lock on the door had been sticking and may be in need of maintenance, as well. It was suggested to price out a new door, or repairing the current one.

Volunteers – Kristen addressed the need for more hosts and ushers, proposing each Council member ask another church member to help. Jeff confirmed that he and the Communion Class students will host once a month, starting in October. Anyone interested in volunteering please let us know.
